CHAINS

Timber consists primarily of fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, pine, madrone, ash, maple, oak, and alder. The undergrowth consists of fern, blackberry, wild rose, Oregon grape, poison oak, salal, thimbleberry, huckleberry, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, salmonberry, and young timber. Portions of the area are being or have been logged. The river bottoms are used for farming and the mountainous areas used for timber and recreation.

The soil types vary from rocky clay in the higher elevations to a sandy loam in the river bottoms. There are numerous rock outcroppings in the higher elevations. There are three dwellings in or near section 9. No evidence of mineral deposits were noted during the survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings along the lines surveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of $19^{\circ} 45'$ E. There is a range of $0^{\circ} 45'$ in local attraction.
