A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 3/4° E., 136 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A hemlock, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 72 1/4° W., 36 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 25° W., 18 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 35 1/2° E., 39 lks. dist., mk. T22S R4W S4 BT.
