A fir, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 63° W., 20 lks.  
dist., with scribe marks T21 4W visible on bark.

A grand fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 66 1/4° E.,  
97 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 21 1/4° W.,  
55 lks. dist., with scribe marks T21S R4W S  
visible on open blaze.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 56 3/4° W.,  
74 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S27 BT.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, chinquapin, fir, cedar, yew, maple, oak, alder,  
madrone, pine, and hemlock; undergrowth, vine maple,  
poison oak, blackberry, Oregon grape, salmonberry,

A root hole, bears S. 55° E., 53 lks. dist.

A sawed fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 78° W.,  
44 lks. dist., no marks visible.  
(Record, 49 lks.)

A sawed cedar stump, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 24° W.,  
51 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on  
opened blaze.
