CHAINS

- 46.05 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 55° E.; desc. 5 ft. over NW. slope.
- 49.25 Ravine, drains S. 55° E.; asc. 315 ft. over broken SE. slope.
- 72.75 The corner of wire fences, extending N., S., E., and W.
- 73.15 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears S. 85° E. and S. 85° W.
- 79.65 Ridge bears N. 55° E. and S. 75° W.; desc. 5 ft. over NW. slope.
- 80.78 The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22, and 23, reestablished by person(s) unknown, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, in wire fence, extending N. and S. This position has long been recognized as the corner by adjacent landowners, and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner, from which the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by person(s) unknown

A decayed fir stump, 34 ins. diam., bears
S. 52° E., 16 lks. dist., with scribe marks
21 R4W T visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

- A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 54 1/2° E., 11 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S14 BT.
- A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 22 1/4° E., 92 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S23 BT.
- A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 29° W., 25 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S22 BT.
- A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 44 1/4° W., 17 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S15 BT.

Reset the iron pipe and set a 6 ft. fiberglass post alongside the iron post.

From this point, United States Geological Survey triangulation station "WARDS 2", bears S. 87°00' W., 39.71 chs. dist., monumented with a standard brass tablet, 3 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, in drill hole in solid rock, with top mkd. WARDS 1934.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay.
Timber, fir, pine, yew, maple, oak, madrone, hemlock, alder, and cedar; undergrowth, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, ferns, wild rose, blackberry, vine maple, and young timber.
