level on the line between sections 3 and 4 to about 1,700 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of sections 2 and 3. The lands are drained by numerous small creeks, all flowing in a westerly direction.

Access is gained by way of Interstate Highway No. 5 to the near vicinity. A number of gravelled and dirt roads extend throughout the area.

The soil is rocky clay. Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, oak, madrone, pine, alder, maple, chinquapin, and ash. The undergrowth is mostly poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, vine maple, salmonberry, blackberry, huckleberry, thimbleberry, wild rose, salal, ferns, and young timber.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of  $18^{\circ} 45'$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of  $2^{\circ}$  due to local attraction.
