CHAINS

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 28° E., 92 lks.
dist., with healed blaze.

No other suitable trees available within limits.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, oak, madrone, chinquapin, and
alder; undergrowth, poison oak, vine maple, manzanita,
hazel, arrowwood, salal, Oregon grape, and young timber.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this resurvey are located
about 6 miles north of Glendale, Oregon. The area is
drained by Lawson Creek, Bear Creek, and their tribu-
taries, which flow southerly to Windy Creek. Access is
by way of several dirt roads extending northerly from
Windy Creek.

The land is mountainous, with the elevations ranging
from about 1600 feet above sea level where the line
between sections 13 and 14 crosses Bear Creek, to about
3200 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 2,
3, 10, and 11.

The soil is composed mainly of rocky clay, with rock
outcroppings at the higher elevations. Timber consists
primarily of fir, with stands of pine, cedar, hemlock,
oak, madrone, chinquapin, maple, and alder. The under-
growth is poison oak, manzanita, hazel, arrowwood, vine
maple, huckleberry, salal, Oregon grape, and young timber.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the
lines resurveyed.

The average of a number of readings taken along the
lines resurveyed gives a value of 20° E. for the mean
magnetic declination. There is a range of 2° due to
local attraction.
