tree, a sawed grand fir stump, 28 ins. diam., with healed blazes on NE., SE, SW and NW. faces, from which the remains of three original bearing trees

A fir, 34 ins. diam., bears N. 5° E., 25 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 48 ins. diam. bears S. 33 1/2° E., 72 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze. (Record, S. 32° E., 69 lks.)

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 37 1/2° W., 47 lks. dist., no marks visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 30° W.)

and the remains of bearing trees and a reference monument mkd. by Godfrey.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 50° E., 74 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 21 3/4° E., 31 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A hemlock, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 16° W., 69 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze.

A sawed chinquapin stump, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 10 1/2° W., 39 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

An iron post, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, bears West, 0.04 chs. dist., with brass cap mkd. COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE T22S R6W S16 S17 S20 S21 1961.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, maple, chinquapin, madrone, and alder; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, poison oak, rhododendron, Oregon grape, fern, and grasses.

From the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, perpetuated and recorded by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy Douglas County Surveyor, in 1961, monumented with a basalt rock outcrop, 4 x 4 x 3 ft. high, mkd. with an X on the NE. face, 2 ft. up, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A sawed fir stump, 60 ins. diam., bears N. 34° E., 37 links dist., no marks visible. (Record, N. 36° E., 39 lks.)

A fir, 80 ins. diam., bears S. 20° E., 188 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 191 lks.)

A fir, 52 ins. diam., bears S. 72° W., 56 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 62 lks.)

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 1° W., 72 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze. (Record, 77 lks.)

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 82° E., 51 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
