level near the corner of sections 21 and 28 only. The area is drained by Thistleburn Creek and Lancaster Creek and their tributaries. Soil consists of rocky clay loam. The lands are forested with fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, chinquapin, and alder; undergrowth consists of vine maple, Oregon grape, rhododendron, salal, fern, and grasses. Access is gained by way of a gravelled road, numerous dirt roads extending from it into the area.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of $18^{\circ} 30'$ E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 2° due to local attraction.
