## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing resurvey are located approximately 18 miles westerly of Roseburg, Oregon. Access into the area is via Callahan Road, Long Ridge Road, and Williams River Road.

The land is mountainous and is unsuitable for agricultural purposes. The elevations range from about 1,150 ft. above sea level where the line between sections 4 and 5 crosses Panther Creek to about 2,500 ft. above sea level near the corner of sections 3, 4, 9, and 10, and the corner of sections 4, 5, 33, and 34 on the north boundary of the township.

The soil is composed of rocky clay in the bottoms to clay loam in the higher elevations. There are good stands of timber located throughout the area consisting of fir, cedar, and hemlock, with lesser stands of tan oak, alder, maple, and yew. The undergrowth is dense due to a large burn years ago, and consists of vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, salal, Oregon grape, huckleberry, thimbleberry, and fern.

The area is drained by Panther Creek which flows diagonally across section 4 in a southwesterly direction, which is, in turn, fed by numerous small streams.

There were no residents located in the area, nor were any signs of mineral deposits noted.

A considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of  $18\ 1/2^\circ$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to  $1\ 1/2^\circ$  due to local attraction.
