A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 10 3/4° E., 58 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S31 BT.

A spruce, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 22 3/4° W., 35 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S36 BT.

From this point, an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., loosely set, projecting 5 ft. above the ground, established by person(s) unknown, bears S. 74 1/2° W., 13 lks. dist.

N. 0° 01' E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend slightly over broken SW. slope.

12.00 Old Highway No. 101, asphalt surfaced, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.

16.00 Clear Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 50° W.; continue ascent over broken SW. slope.

26.40 Clear Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 30° E.; continue ascent over broken SW. slope.

28.90 Old Highway No. 101, asphalt surfaced, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.

33.20 Clear Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 80° W.; asc. 50 ft. over broken SW. slope.

39.88 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, monumented with a 1 1/4 in. axle, firmly set, projecting 1 ft. above the ground. Douglas County Surveyor's records show that in 1955, James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, found this monument to be properly related to two original bearing trees which no longer exist. It is accepted as the best available evidence of the original corner, from which the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Byron in 1955

A pine, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 37° E., 36 lks. dist., with scribe marks R12W S30 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 12° W., 24 lks. dist., with scribe marks R13W S25 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

and a tree mkd. by person(s) unknown

A pine, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 71° E., 24 lks. dist., mkd. with a healed blaze.
