<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The lands included in the foregoing survey are located in Douglas County, Oregon. The southeast corner of section 36 is approximately 2 1/2 miles north of the city of Lakeside.</p> <p>The general character of the terrain is rolling sand dunes, some of which are drifting sand and some are covered with vegetation. Elevations range from sea level along the shore of the Pacific Ocean to approximately 300 feet above sea level near the one-quarter section corner of sections 13 and 24. Timber consists of spruce, fir, shore pine, cedar, alder, and chinquapin with undergrowth of huckleberry, salal, rhododendron, young timber, blackberry, willow, Scotch broom, Oregon grape, and manzanita.</p> <p>The southeast portion of the area is drained by Clear Creek, which drains southerly to Eel Lake. Generally, the rest of the area has no surface drainage.</p> <p>Access into the area is by way of U.S. Highway No. 101 and old Highway No. 101, and numerous other sand roads which branch off these main roads.</p>
