From this point, the original closing cor. of secs. 30 and 31, bears S. 89° 51' W., 0.045 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by Forrest J. LaFlamme, Registered Land Surveyor No. 473, in 1969, monumented with an iron rod, 5/8 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A fir snag, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 55° E., 45 lks. dist., no marks visible. (Record, 47 lks.)

A fir snag, 19 ins. diam., bears S. 76° E., 6 lks. dist., no marks visible.

A fir snag, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 4° E., 16 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks S31 CC BT 473 visible on open blaze.

From this same point, the angle point of secs. 25 and 30, Tps. 29 S., Rs. 9 and 10 W., bears N. 0° 59' W., 1.69 chs. dist., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the E. Bdy. of T. 29 S., R. 10 W., executed concurrently under these same groups, and Group No. 1067.
