38.87	The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9, and meander cor. on E. shore of Carter Lake. Land, rolling. Soil, sandy loam. Timber, spruce, fir, hemlock, cedar, and alder; undergrowth, salal, huckleberry, rhododendron, young timber, blackberry, willow, and fern.
	N. 1° 08' E., bet. secs. 4 and 5. Thence across Carter Lake.
7.57	Point for the meander cor. of secs. 4 and 5, on E. shore of Carter Lake, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner, no permanent monument established.
