CHAINS

N. 0° 03' W., bet. secs. 7 and 12, marking the true line.

Descend 70 ft. over N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

3.00 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 190 ft. over broken SE. slope.

30.40 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 260 ft. over broken N. slope.

36.01 Point for the witness cor. to the meander cor. of secs. 7 and 12 on the left bank of the Umpqua River, at record distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original witness corner. No permanent monument established.

36.51 Point for the meander cor. of secs. 7 and 12 on the left bank of the Umpqua River, at record distance. No permanent monument established.

36.75 From this point, a point established and recroded by James W. Byron, County Surveyor, in 1967, bears West, 0.617 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. T22S R13W R12W S12 ~~S12~~ 1967.

Continue over nearly level land.

40.00 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, based on the plat approved October 19, 1857; this corner was not called for in the original field notes. No permanent monument established.

40.60 Asphalt surfaced road, 40 lks. wide, bears E. and W.

41.00 Left bank of the Umpqua River, bears E. and W.; thence across Winchester Bay.

80.00 Point for the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12, at record distance; located in Winchester Bay.

Land, S 1/2 mile, mountainous, N 1/2 mile, Winchester Bay.
Soil, S 1/2 mile, sandy loam.
Timber, S 1/2 mile, spruce, fir, hemlock, pine, and alder; undergrowth, salmonberry, huckleberry, vine maple, Oregon grape, salal, arrowwood, hazel, and fern.

N. 0° 03' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Continue across Winchester Bay.

40.00 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at record distance; located in Winchester Bay.

Continue across bay.

48.50 Right bank of the Umpqua River, leave Winchester Bay, edge bears N. 70° E. and S. 70° W.; asc. slightly over rolling sand dunes.

51.50 Point for the meander cor. of secs. 1 and 6 on the right bank of the Umpqua River, at record distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
