1.00	Top of ascent, slopes S.; desc. 115 ft. over broken W. slope.
13.05	Enter rolling sand dunes, edge bears N. 10° E. and S. 10° W.
20.00	Point for the E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 18 and 19.  Set an aluminum rod, 16 ft. long, 5/8 in. diam., 15 1/2 ft. in the ground, in concrete, with aluminum cap mkd.  <div style="text-align: center;"> <math display="block">E \frac{1}{16} \begin{array}{l} S \ 18 \\ S \ 19 \end{array}</math> <p>1981</p> </div> <p style="text-align: center;">No suitable trees available within limits.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Set a steel fence post alongside aluminum rod.</p> <p>Continue over rolling sand dunes.</p>
32.30	Leave sand dunes, enter light timber and dense undergrowth, edge bears N. and S.; asc. 55 ft. over SE. slope.
35.60	Ridge, bears N. 30° E. and S. 30° W.; desc. 35 ft. over NW. slope.
36.85	Draw, drains N.; asc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.
38.85	Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 45 ft. over NW. slope.
40.00	Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 18 and 19, at record distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. 55.85	Top of ascent, slopes SW.; desc. 110 ft. over W. slope.
66.00	Bottom of descent, slopes SW.; enter rolling sand dunes, edge bears N. 10° E. and S. 10° W.
76.00	The meander cor. of secs. 18 and 19, on the shore of the Pacific Ocean, determined from the remains of an original bearing tree:  <div style="margin-left: 40px;"> <p>A spruce snag, 35 ins. diam., bears N. 75 1/2° E., 1160 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened blaze.</p> </div>
