CHAINS

The soil is generally composed of sand and sandy loam. Timber consists mainly of beach pine, spruce, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and chinquapin; with undergrowth of salal, rhododendron, hazel, Oregon grape, huckleberry, salmonberry, thimbleberry, blackberry, wax myrtle, manzanita, and kinnikinnic.

Access into the area is by United State Highway 101, and an improved dirt road leaving United States Highway 101 to the west in section 16.

There are no permanent residents living in this area. There is no evidence of current development, cultivation or mineral deposits in the area covered by the resurvey.

The average of several readings throughout the area gives a value of $19^{\circ} 15'$ E. for the mean magnetic declination, with no noticeable difference due to local attraction.
