GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands embraced in this survey are located about 7 miles south of Camas Valley, Oregon. The area is drained by Boulder Creek. The elevations range from about 1,200 feet above sea level near the south 1/16 section corner of sections 19 and 24, on the west boundary of the township, to about 2,000 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of sections 18 and 19.

Access is by way of Oregon State Highway No. 42 and a number of dirt and gravelled roads extending from it into the area.

Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, myrtle, madrone, alder, chinquapin, and dogwood, with undergrowth of salal, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, rhododendron, fern, and grasses.

The soil is composed of rocky clay loam, with some small boulders exposed.

No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the area covered by this resurvey.

The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the area gives a value of 20° E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 4° in local attraction.
