A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 2° E., 29 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 68° E., 19 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 19° W., 9 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew, alder, oak, madrone, and chinquapin; undergrowth, hazel, blackberry, poison oak, Oregon grape, manzanita, buckbrush, wild rose, fern, salal, rhododendron, arrowwood, salmonberry, thimbleberry, huckleberry, and young timber.
