78.30 Spur, slopes S. 40° W.; desc. 55 ft. over SW. slope.
 79.80 Ravine, drains S. 10° W.; asc. slightly over SE. slope.
 79.84 The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33.
 Land, mountainous.
 Soil, rocky clay.
 Timber, fir, cedar, pine, alder, ash, oak, hemlock, yew, madrone, and maple; undergrowth, poison oak, vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, blackberry, salmonberry, fern, wild rose, salal, and young timber.

N. 89° 22' W., bet. secs. 29 and 32.

Ascend 55 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.15 Spur, slopes S. 20° W.; desc. 190 ft. over SW. slope.

22.25 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course S. 20° W.; asc. 240 ft. over broken SE. slope.

39.62 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 32, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 1 1/2° E., 35 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S29 BT.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 8° E., 30 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S32 BT.

From this point, a corner established by person(s) unknown, bears N. 41° 37' E., 0.383 chs. dist., monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, from which bearing trees mkd. by person(s) unknown.

A cedar, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 8 1/2° W., 24 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 30° W., 14 1/2 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

Ascend 20 ft. over SE. slope.

42.50 Ridge, bears N. 5° W. and S. 5° E.; desc. 440 ft. over broken SW. slope.

58.90 Fitch Creek, 30 lks. wide, course S. 40° E.; asc. 10 ft. over SW. slope.

59.43 Point for the W 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 32.
