A sawed fir stump, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 14 1/2° E.,
32 lks. dist., with scribe marks T24S R1W S21 BT
visible on an opened blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 11 1/2° E.,
56 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.
(Record, S. 14° E.)

A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears S. 4° W., 47 lks.
dist., with scribe marks T24S R1W S29 BT visible
on opened blaze.

A fir snag, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 10° W., 27 lks.
dist., with scribe marks 24 R W visible on
partially healed blaze. (Record, N. 4° W.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Godfrey

A fir, 39 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W., 15 1/2 lks.
dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible
on partially healed double blaze.

The cor. lies in timber edge, bears N. and S., with
timber to the west; no suitable trees available to the
east.

N. 0° 24' W., bet. secs. 20 and 21, marking and blazing
the true line.

Ascend 110 ft. over broken SE. slope, through scattering
timber and dense undergrowth.
