**GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

The area covered by this resurvey is located about 18 miles northeast of Glide, Oregon. Access to this area is via Rock Creek Road and numerous other dirt and gravelled access roads traversing the area. The elevation varies from about 3,520 feet above sea level near the closing corner of sections 1 and 6, to about 1,760 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of sections 6 and 7.

The area is drained by Rock Creek and its tributaries flowing southwesterly to the North Umpqua River.

The soil is made up of rocky clay loam. The land is used primarily for growing timber with some recreational use. The timber consists of fir, pine, yew, hemlock, maple, oak, chinquapin, alder, madrone, and wild cherry. The undergrowth is made up of hazel, arrowwood, Oregon grape, fern, vine maple, blackberry, salmonberry, huckleberry, poison oak, salal, rhododendron, and young timber.

No mineral deposits or mining activity were noted during the resurvey.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of 19° 45' E., with a range of 0° 45' in local attraction.
