## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area covered by this survey is located about two miles west of the city of Canyonville, Oregon. Access is gained by County Road Nos. 20A and 21, with other gravelled and dirt roads extending into the area. The elevation ranges from about 840 feet above sea level near the S 1/16 section corner of sections 29 and 30 to about 1,520 feet above sea level near the center S 1/16 section corner of section 29.

The area is drained by Mitchell Creek and Jordan Creek, with numerous seasonal drainages flowing northerly to the South Umpqua River.

The soil is generally rocky clay and is suited primarily for farming and timber lands. The timber consists of fir, cedar, yew, pine, alder, chinquapin, oak, madrone, and ash. The undergrowth consists of poison oak, hazel, arrowwood, Oregon grape, fern, blackberry, thimbleberry, huckleberry, salmonberry, salal, vine maple, and young timber.

No mineral deposits were noted during the survey.

The average of a number of readings along the lines surveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of 19° 45' E., with a range of 0° 30' in location attraction.
