- 13.45 Tenmile Creek, 40 lks. wide, course S. 25° W.; asc. broken NE. slope.
  
- 18.24 Intersect the E. and W. center line of the NW 1/4 of sec. 23.  
  
 From this point the NW 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 23, hereinafter described, bears S. 89° 56' W., 6.06 chs. dist.
  
- 24.31 Intersect the N. and S. center line of the NW 1/4 of sec. 23.  
  
 Point for the crossing closing cor. of the N. and S. center line of the NW 1/4 of sec. 23, with the S. bdy. of Donation Land Claim No. 40, hereinafter described.  
  
 From this point, the NW 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 23, hereinafter described, bears N. 0° 07' W., 0.03 chs. dist.
  
- 24.98 Point for the exterior cor. on the S. bdy. of Donation Land Claim No. 40, determined by the method of broken boundaries; there is no remaining evidence of the original cor.  
  
 Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., with magnetic, plastic breakaway base, 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

 From this point the NW 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 23, hereinafter described, bears N. 89° 56' E., 0.67 chs. dist.
  
- 12.20 Tenmile Creek, 25 lks. wide, course S. 70° E.; asc. SW. slope.
  
- 12.42 Point for the interior cor. on the S. bdy. of Donation Land Claim No. 40, determined by the method of broken boundaries; there is no remaining evidence of the original cor.
