37.60	Creek, 10 lks. wide, course S. 5° W.; asc. over SE. slope.

Soil, sandy clay loam. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, and maple; under- growth, vine maple, huckleberry, hazel, salmonberry, arrowwood, salal, and fern.
Subdivision of Section 27, T. 20 S., R. 9 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon	
	From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 27 and 34. N. 1° 15' W., on the N. and S. center line of sec. 27, marking and blazing the true line. Ascend over SE. slope, through moderate timber and light undergrowth.
