42 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks
visible on bark blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 26 ins. diam., bears S. 62° E.,
36 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 21 ins. diam., bears S. 51° W., 45 lks.
dist., with healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A grand fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N, 19° E.,
125 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S6 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine, hemlock, yew, alder, madrone,
oak, willow, and ash; undergrowth, hazel, poison oak,
fern, salal, arrowwood, blackberry, salmonberry, thimble-
berry, huckleberry, vine maple, wild rose, and young
timber.

A fir snag, 42 ins. diam., bears N. 60° W., 2 lks.
dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S BT visible on bark
blaze.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Corbin

A hemlock stump, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 2 1/2° W.,
57 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record,
N. 4° E.)

A hemlock, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 2° W., 53 lks.
dist., with healed blaze. (Record, yew.)

and a new bearing tree

A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 79 1/2° E., 30 lks.
dist., mkd. 1/4 S36 BT.

S. 89° 54' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36, marking and blazing
the true line.

Ascend over broken SE. slope, through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth.
