A decayed fir stump, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 38° E., 48 lks. dist., with axe marks visible on decayed blaze. (Record, N. 40° E., 44 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Arthur Boyer, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1936

A maple, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 85 1/2° E., 78 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, East, 73 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Ben B. Irving, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1945

A yew, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 47° W., 60 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze. (Record, N. 49° W.)

and bearing trees mkd. by Corbin

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 158 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A maple, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 162 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze. (Record, 160 lks.)

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 76° W., 130 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, 132 lks.)

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 6° W., 68 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 7 1/2° W.)

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay.  
Timber, oak, ash, fir, cedar, maple, madrone, hemlock, yew, pine, willow, and dogwood; undergrowth, fern, blackberry, huckleberry, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, salal, wild rose, salmonberry, thimbleberry, and young timber.

N. 0° 14' W., bet. secs. 1 and 2.

Ascend over SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
