## CHAINS

The timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, pine, madrone, ash, maple, oak, alder, and cascara. The undergrowth is made up of fern, blackberry, wild rose, thimbleberry, Oregon grape, poison oak, salal, huckleberry, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, salmonberry, and young timber. Portions of the area have been logged with heavy stands of young timber.

The soil types vary from a rocky clay in the higher elevations to a clay loam in the creek bottoms. There are numerous rock outcroppings in the higher elevations. No evidence of mineral deposits was noted during the course of the resurvey.

The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the resurvey gives a value of  $19^{\circ} 30'$  E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of  $1^{\circ} 15'$  in local attraction.
