	<p><b>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</b></p> <p>The lands included in the foregoing resurvey are located in mountainous country, about five miles east of Sutherlin, Oregon. The elevation ranges from about 720 feet above sea level at the one-quarter section corner of sections 19 and 24, to about 1920 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 28, 29, 32, and 33.</p> <p>The area is drained by Sutherlin Creek and its tributaries. The soil consists of a rocky clay changing to a sandy loam in the major creek bottoms. The lands are forested with fir, hemlock, pine, yew, cedar, oak, ash, maple, chinquapin, madrone, cottonwood, and alder. The undergrowth consists of vine maple, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, blackberry, salmonberry, huckleberry, salal, wild rose, Oregon grape, fern, and young timber.</p> <p>Access is gained by way of a gravelled logging road traversing the area with numerous gravelled and dirt roads branching from it.</p> <p>There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed.</p> <p>The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 45' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° 30' due to local attraction.</p>
