GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located approximately 10 miles southeasterly from the town of Yoncalla, Oregon. Access is gained by way of a paved road in Shoestring Valley with gravelled and dirt roads branching from it into the area.

The area is drained by tributaries flowing northwesterly to Walker Creek. The elevations range from about 1,900 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 23, 24, 25, and 26, to about 1,000 feet above sea level at the 1/4 section corner of sections 11 and 14.

The soil in the area is composed generally of a rocky clay, with a clay loam in the main creek bottoms. Timber consists of ash, maple, fir, hemlock, madrone, yew, alder, cedar, and chinquapin. The undergrowth is mainly poison oak, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, Oregon grape, fern, wild rose, blackberry, huckleberry, salmonberry, and young timber.

There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines surveyed.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° in local attraction.
