<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Section 32, Township 31 South, Range 7 West, is located in mountainous terrain, about 12 miles southwesterly of Riddle, Oregon. The elevations range from about 1,200 feet above sea level where Middle Creek crosses the north and south center line of section 32, to about 2,000 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 4, 5, 32, and 33. The section is drained by Middle Creek which flows in a southwesterly direction to Cow Creek.</p> <p>Access is gained by way of a gravelled road which follows Middle Creek and a number of gravelled and dirt roads branching from it into the area.</p> <p>The soil consists of rocky clay. The lands are forested with fir, cedar, pine, oak, maple, madrone, alder, chinquapin, ash, and yew. Undergrowth consists of vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, poison oak, rhododendron, salal, Oregon grape, ceanothus, huckleberry, manzanita, blackberry, salmonberry, wild rose, young timber, and fern.</p> <p>No evidence of mineral activity was noted along the lines surveyed.</p> <p>The average of a number of readings along the lines surveyed gives a value of 18° 30' E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 0° 45' due to local attraction.</p>
