The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11, monumented with the original corner tree, a fir, 14 ins. diam., mkd. with healed blazes on NE., SE., SW., and NW. faces, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A sawed fir stump, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 62° E., 90 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on bark blaze.

A fir, 55 ins. diam., bears S. 16° E., 50 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze.

A root hole, bears S. 38° W., 94 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, size indeterminate, no marks visible.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 25° W., 70 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze.

and a bearing tree and reference monument mkd. by Beck

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 62° E., 74 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, S. 65° E.)

An iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, bears N. 62° E., 19 1/2 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. T32S R7W S2 RM 1964 and an arrow pointing to the corner.

and a new bearing tree

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 24° E., 24 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T32S R7W S2 BT.

No other suitable trees available within limits.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, yew, pine, madrone, oak, alder, cedar, maple, and chinquapin; undergrowth, poison oak, manzanita, Oregon grape, ceanothus, rhododendron, hazel, arrowwood, salal, fern, blackberry, huckleberry, and young timber.

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9, perpetuated and recorded by John M. Powell, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
