A black oak, 4 ins. diam., bears N. 9 3/4° W.,  
30 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. X at breast height and BT  
at base.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, pine, fir, cedar, oak, chinquapin, maple, and  
madrone; undergrowth, poison oak, Oregon grape, salal,  
ceanothus, blackberry, manzanita, grass, and weeds.

From the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33, and 34, monumented  
with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting  
6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

diam., no marks visible on decayed blaze.

A madrone, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 56° W.,  
70 lks. dist., no marks visible on decayed blaze.

85 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 19 ins. diam., bears S. 24° E.,

dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 20° W., 117 lks.  
dist., with healed blaze.
