

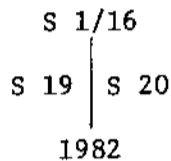
# County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines, 17584  
T. 33 S., R. 6 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

**CHAINS**

Southern Pacific railroad, bears N. 50° E. and S. 50° W.  
Asphalt surfaced road, 45 lks. wide, bears NE. and SW.  
Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.  
Spur, slopes N. 80° E.; desc. over N. slope.  
Point for the S 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20.  
Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam.,  
14 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of  
stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 61 3/4° E.,  
53 lks. dist., mkd. S 1/16 S20 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 61 3/4° W.,  
40 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. S 1/16 S19 BT.

The corner is located in ravine, drains NE.

From this point, a corner established and recorded by  
John R. White, Registered Engineer, No. 1306, in 1946,  
bears S. 9° 00' W., 0.126 chs. dist., monumented with an  
iron pipe, 1/2 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins.  
above ground, from which the remains of bearing trees  
mkd. by White

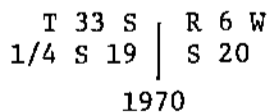
A black oak, 31 ins. diam., bears N. 16 1/4° E.,  
31 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir snag, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 85 1/4° W.,  
33 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible  
on partially healed blaze.

Ascend along broken E. slope.

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 20, perpetuated and  
recorded by John R. White, Registered Engineer, No. 1306  
in 1946, and subsequently perpetuated and recorded by  
Roger T. Reece, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1970, monu-  
mented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set,  
projecting 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.



from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A root hole, bears N. 53° E., 72 lks. dist.,  
alongside of which is lying a ponderosa pine,  
size indeterminate, no marks visible.

A root hole with black oak sprouts, bears S. 50° W.,  
65 lks. dist.
