CHAINS

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 29° E., 31 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 7° E., 12 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A madrone, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 76 1/4° W., 58 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.
(Record, S. 75° W., 53 lks.)

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 70° W., 30 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, pine, fir, cedar, oak, maple, chinquapin, and madrone; undergrowth, poison oak, Oregon grape, manzanita, blackberry, salal, ceanothus, young timber, grass, and weeds.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this resurvey are located about 2 1/2 miles westerly from the community of Wolf Creek, Oregon.

The land is mountainous, except for the valley bottom along Wolf Creek. Elevations range from about 1,200 feet above sea level near the southeast corner of section 19 to about 3,200 feet above sea level on the divide between Wolf Creek and Cow Creek drainage. The area is drained by Wolf Creek, Grave Creek, Cow Creek, and numerous small tributaries draining into them.

The soil is rocky clay in the mountainous regions, with clay loam in the valley bottoms. Agriculture consists of small pastures, hay fields, and gardens in the valley bottoms. Timber consists of fir, pine, oak, madrone, chinquapin, maple, and alder. Undergrowth consists of poison oak, manzanita, blackberry, salal, ceanothus, Oregon grape, and young timber.

Access into the area is by way of an asphalt surfaced county road which intersects Interstate Highway No. 5 in section 22, and crosses the township in a southwest direction up Wolf Creek. Several unimproved access roads lead into the area from this county road.

There are numerous dwellings and other structures in the valley bottoms of the area surveyed.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines surveyed.
