A madrone, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 18° E., 64 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A maple, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 53 3/4° E., 168 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A grand fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 78 1/2° W., 224 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

A grand fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 84 1/2° W., 148 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

From this same point the meander cor. of secs. 30 and 31, on the left bank of the Umpqua River, bears S. 84° 04' W., 11.42 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above the mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 58 1/2° W., 30 1/2 lks. dist., with a healed blaze.

These control lines were fully retraced, and no evidence of the intervening corners was found.

From this same point, the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey triangulation station "KELLOGG 1953", bears N. 48° 06' W., 105.66 chs. dist., monumented with a concrete filled iron post, 5 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with 4 in. diam. brass cap mkd.
