GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located about 18 miles northwesterly of the town of Sutherlin, Oregon, in Douglas County. The area is drained by McGee Creek, Waggoner Creek, and their tributaries flowing northeasterly into the Umpqua River. The Umpqua River flows in a northwesterly direction across the northeast corner of section 31. Elevations range from about 210 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 29, 30, 31, and 32, to about 720 feet above sea level near the one-quarter section corner of sections 31 and 36.

Access into the area is via Bullock Road, McGee Creek Road, and other gravelled and dirt roads.

Soil in the area is composed of a sandy clay loam. The timber consists of fir, cedar, hemlock, oak, maple, ash, chinquapin, madrone, and willow. Undergrowth is made up of vine maple, hazel, thimbleberry, huckleberry, arrowwood, salmonberry, blackberry, ceanothus, poison oak, Oregon grape, Scotch broom, salal, and fern.

No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the area covered by this resurvey.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area, gives a value of 20° E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 0° 30' in local attraction.
