- 73.25 Trail, bears N. 15° W. and S. 15° E.
- 80.00 The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.

- A cedar stub, 36 ins. diam., 18 ft. high, bears S. 44° E., 71 lks. dist., mkd. T 31 S R 1 E S 15 B T. (Old B.T.)
- A willow, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 36° W., 67 lks. dist., mkd. T 31 S R 1 E S 16 B T. (Old B.T.)
- A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 15° W., 197 lks. dist., blaze practically healed; I do not open. (Old B.T.)
- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 27° E., 276 lks. dist., mkd. T 31 S R 1 E S 15 B T. (New B.T.)
- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 10° W., 202 lks. dist., mkd. T 31 S R 1 E S 16 B T. (New B.T.)

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, sandy loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.  
 Timber, fir, cedar, pine, chinquapin, madrona, and yew.  
 Undergrowth, vinemaple, willow, hazel, spirea, slickleaf,  
 and Oregon grape.

- Asc. 10 ft. over E. slope, through dense undergrowth.
- 4.40 Draw, drains S. 15° E.; asc. 30 ft. over SE. slope.
- 6.45 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.; asc. 480 ft. over SE. slope, changing to SW. slope.
- 33.23 Trail, bears S. 75° E. and S. 75° W.
- 34.20 Divide bet. South Umpqua River and Rogue River, bears E. and W.; desc. 85 ft. over N. slope.
- 40.00 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 9 and 10, which is an iron post, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. above ground, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.
- The 1/4 sec. cor. is in a small swampy draw, draining NW.
