From this point, the original cor. of secs. 32 and 33 only, bears S. 0° 02' W., 0.06 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by Bruce R. Rogers, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1965, and further perpetuated and recorded by Gary Langlitz, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1975, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/4 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE T22S R5W S32 S33 CC 1965, from which the remaining original bearing tree

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 23° E., 12 lks.
dist., with scribe mark 3 visible on
partially healed blaze.

A maple, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 65° W., 55 lks.
dist., with scribe marks 5W S32 CS B visible
on partially healed double blaze.

From this same point, the standard cor. of secs. 4 and 5, T. 23 S., R. 5 W., bears S. 89° 59' E., 5.08 chs. dist., described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the N. bdy., T. 23 S., R. 5 W. (Fifth Standard Parallel South), executed concurrently under this same Group.

N. 0° 02' E., bet. secs. 32 and 33, marking and blazing the true line.

Descend over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.70 Ravine, drains E.; asc. over SE. slope.

4.25 Spur, slopes S. 70° E.; asc. over SE. slope.

19.71 Point for the S 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 32 and 33.

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
