scribe marks visible on opened blaze.

A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 66° W., 68 lks.
dist., no marks visible. (Record, 72 lks.)

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 32° E., 22 lks.
dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 33 ins. diam., bears S. 86 1/2° E., 28 lks.
dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 37 ins. diam., bears S. 3 3/4° E., 44 lks.
dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 19 ins. diam., bears N. 40 1/2° W., 78 lks.
dist., with healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, oak, yew, alder,
maple, chinquapin, ash; undergrowth, poison oak, vine
maple, blackberry, huckleberry, ferns, arrowwood, hazel,
Oregon grape, salal, wild rose, and young timber.

From the cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33, and 34, perpetuated
and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor,
in 1958, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/4 ins. diam.,
firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with brass
cap mkd.

A white oak, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 54° W.,
165 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A maple, 29 ins. diam., bears N. 33 1/2° W.,
88 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

64 lks. dist.
