Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder, dogwood, and madrone; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, thimbleberry, huckleberry, salmonberry, Oregon grape, salal, poison oak, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A maple, 58 ins. diam., bears S. 10° W., 100 lks. dist., with decayed blaze, no marks visible.

A cedar snag, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 11° E., 33 lks. dist., with scribe marks T19S R8W S24 BT visible on open blaze.

A hemlock, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 29 1/2° W., 92 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks T19S R8W S23 BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 12° E., 98 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R8W S13 BT.

A cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 38 1/2° E., 94 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R8W S24 BT.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 61 1/4° W., 101 lks. dist., mkd. T19S R8W S14 BT.

N. 0° 09' E., bet. secs. 13 and 14.

Ascend 100 ft. along broken E. slope, through scattering timber and moderate undergrowth.

0.35 Gravelled road, 15 lks. wide, bears S. 80° W. and N. 70° E.

20.00 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 90 ft. over NE. slope.

25.00 Enter bottom land, edge bears E. and W.; thence over nearly level bottom land.

40.77 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 13 and 14, perpetuated by person(s) unknown, monumented with an iron bar, 5/8 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A rotted and shattered fir stump, size indeterminate, bears S. 32° E., 37 lks. dist., with remains of overgrowth and face, no marks visible.
