A sawed fir stump, 46 ins. diam., bears N. 26 1/2° E.,  
 42 1/2 lks. dist., with partially healed blaze, no  
 marks visible. (Record, N. 21° E., 40 lks.)

A root hole, bears S. 46 1/2° E., 36 lks. dist.,  
 with a down and rotted fir, size indeterminate,  
 alongside, no marks visible.

A root hole, bears N. 4 1/2° W., 44 lks. dist., with  
 a rotted fir, 43 ins. diam., alongside, no marks  
 visible.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Lytle and  
 Norseth

A sawed fir stump, 26 ins. diam., bears N. 72° E.,  
 138 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 37 ins. diam., bears S. 25 1/2° E.,  
 80 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 84 1/2° W.,  
 191 lks. dist., with healed blaze.  
 (Record, 186 lks.)

A sawed fir stump, 38 ins. diam., bears N. 55 1/2° W.,  
 57 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

No other suitable trees available within limits.

Set a 6 ft. steel fence post alongside thr iron post.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, alder, chinquapin, dogwood, and  
 maple; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood,  
 huckleberry, poison oak, salal, Oregon grape, and fern.

North bet. secs. 3 and 4.

Descend 100 ft. over NW. slope, through logged area.

3.70 Enter river bottom land, edge bears N. 80° E. and  
 S. 80° W.; desc. 5 ft. over river bottom, also enter  
 medium timber and moderate undergrowth.

5.40 Right bank of Siuslaw River, bears N. 80° E. and  
 S. 80° W., course N. 85° E.; thence across river.

7.25 Left bank of Siuslaw River, bears N. 85° E. and  
 S. 85° W.; desc. 10 ft. over river bottom.

30.00 Left bank of Siuslaw River, bears N. 25° W. and  
 S. 25° E., course N. 25° W.; thence across river.

34.50 Right bank of Siuslaw River, bears same, asc. 20 ft. over  
 river bottom.

40.35 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 4, determined from the  
 remains of the original bearing trees

 bears N. 30° E., 113 lks. dist., no marks visible.
