## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located in the coast range approximately 30 miles west of Eugene, Oregon. The area is drained primarily by the Siuslaw River and its tributaries. The elevations along the lines surveyed range from about 350 feet above sea level near the standard 1/4 section corner of section 35, Township 18 South, Range 8 West, to about 1,300 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of sections 25 and 26.

Access is gained by way of the Siuslaw Access Road and by numerous gravelled and dirt logging roads.

Soil is composed of rocky clay, from a few inches deep at the higher elevations with some sandy loam along the river bottom with a depth of several feet. The soil is suited primarily for the growing of timber with timber harvesting and recreation being the chief activities of the area. Timber consists primarily of fir, hemlock, alder, and maple, with some cedar, chinquapin, madrone, and dogwood. Undergrowth consists of vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, blackberry, thimbleberry, salmonberry, poison oak, Oregon grape, salal, and fern.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted in the area covered by the survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 27' E. for the mean magnetic declination, with a range of 2° 30' in local attraction.
