GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The portion of the township covered by this resurvey lies in Douglas County about 2 1/2 miles southwest of the town of Lookingglass, Oregon. The northern portion of the township is drained by Lookingglass Creek which flows in a southeasterly direction through the township, with numerous other small drainages flowing into Lookingglass Creek. The main access to the area is via Larson Road and numerous other gravel and dirt roads. Elevations range from about 720 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 3, 4, 9, and 10, to about 1,300 feet above sea level near the center E 1/16 section corner of section 9.

Timber consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, madrone, maple, and alder. The undergrowth consists of fern, blackberry, poison oak, salal, arrowwood, hazel, vine maple, Oregon grape, and young timber. Portions of the area have been logged. The creek bottoms are used for farming and the mountainous areas are used for timber and recreation.

The soil consists of a rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings over all parts of the resurvey gives a value of 18° 30' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° 30' in location attraction.
