CHAINS

A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 31° W.,  
25 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.  
(Record, S. 28 1/2° W.)

and the remains of the bearing trees mkd. by Zirpel,  
Roseberry, and Corbin

A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 30 1/4° E.,  
64 lks. dist., with scribe marks T25S R4W S13  
visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 41 1/4° E.,  
56 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar stump, 19 ins. diam., bears S. 47° W.,  
42 lks. dist., with scribe marks T25S R4W S23  
BT visible on opened blaze.

A cedar, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 25 3/4° W.,  
65 lks. dist., with scribe marks 25S R4W S14  
BT visible on partially healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, stony clay loam.  
Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, dogwood, and madrone;  
undergrowth, salal, vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, and  
poison oak.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 27, monumented with  
an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 1 in.  
above the ground, with brass cap mkd.

60 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks  
visible on open blaze.

A fir stump, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 43 1/2° W.,  
43 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible  
on partially decayed blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 21 1/4° W., 49 lks.  
dist., with healed blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by the County Surveyors Office in  
1965

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 70° E., 54 lks.  
dist., with healed double blaze.
