GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>Section 31 is located approximately six and one-half miles southwesterly of the small town of Elkton, Oregon. Access into the section is by way of Lutsinger Creek Road from the northwest, and Bridge Road from the east.</p> <p>The area is primarily drained by a tributary of Lutsinger Creek, flowing northwesterly into the Umpqua River. Elevations range from about 320 feet above sea level where Lutsinger Creek crosses the line between sections 30 and 31, to about 1,040 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 29, 30, 31, 32. Soil in the area is composed of sandy clay loam, from a few inches to several feet in depth overlying sandstone bedrock.</p> <p>Timber consists of fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, alder, chinquapin, and madrone; undergrowth, vine maple, salmonberry, huckleberry, Oregon grape, salal, arrowwood, ferns, and grasses.</p> <p>No evidence of mineral activity was noted in the area.</p> <p>The average of several readings gives a value of 19° 00' E. for the mean magnetic declination.</p>
