land

6.00 Left bank of Smith River, bears N. 75° E. and  
S. 75° W.; course S. 75° W., thence across river.

7.15 Right bank of Smith River, bears N. 75° E. and  
S. 75° W.; asc. over SE. slope.

9.05 Smith River Road, paved, 30 lks. wide, bears N. 70° E.  
and S. 70° W.

18.45 Leave timber, edge bears NW. and SE.; enter young fir  
reproduction.

39.90 Spur, slopes E.; desc. over NE. slope.

40.71 Point for the center 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 2, at inter-  
section with the E. and W. center line.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam.,  
24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
