CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the subdivision of section 33, Township 24 South, Range 4 West, Willamette Meridian, Oregon.

The history of surveys pertaining to this survey, is as follows:

The south boundary of the township and a portion of the subdivisional lines were surveyed by Harvey Gordon and Charles Gardner, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1855.

Donation Land Claim, No. 45, was surveyed by Dennis Hathorn, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1856.

A portion of the south boundary and subdivisional lines was surveyed by James E. Jelley, Cadastral Surveyor, in 1979.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions dated August 30, 1983, under Group No. 1178, Oregon.

The directions of the lines were determined by deflection angles turned from azimuths obtained by direct solar observations, and refer to the true meridian.

Only the true line field notes are given herein. Only those lines bounding public lands were blazed. All lines not forming closures were measured twice to preclude error.

The geographic position of the 1/4 section corner of sections 33 and 34, as scaled from United States Geological Survey quadrangle map "GLIDE, OREGON", prepared in 1954, is as follows:

Latitude 43° 26.4' N. Longitude 123° 10.0' W.

The mean magnetic declination is 19° 30' E.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 23° E., 6 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S33 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 52 1/2° E., 40 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
