Dependent Resurvey, Portion of the Subdivisional Lines, **17825**  
 T. 20 S., R. 10 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

**CHAINS**

From this point, a corner established by person(s) unknown, bears S. 64° E., 0.039 chs. dist., monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground.

The corner is located in edge of timber, bears N. and W.

Ascend over SW. slope, changing to SE. slope, along W. edge of timber.

26.50 Ridge, bears N. 70° E. and S. 80° W.; desc. over NW. slope. Also leave timber, edge bears S. and E.; enter logged area.

29.55 Gravelled road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 35° E. and S. 40° W.

35.10 Spur, slopes N. 50° W.; desc. over NE. slope, also leave logged area, edge bears N. 50° W. and S. 50° E.; enter timber.

39.82 The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A maple, 35 ins. diam., bears N. 89 3/4° E., 117 lks. dist., no marks visible.  
 (Record, N. 88 3/4° E., 105 lks.)

A cedar, 72 ins. diam., bears S. 15 1/2° E., 140 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 32 ins. diam., bears S. 27° W., 62 lks. dist., with scribe marks  
 20S R10 34 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

A cedar, 42 ins. diam., bears N. 80 1/2° W., 24 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, rocky and sandy loam.  
 Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, alder, and maple; undergrowth, vine maple, huckleberry, salmonberry, Oregon grape, salal, rhododendron, ferns, and grasses.

N. 88° 49' W., bet. secs. 27 and 34.

Ascend over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

2.20 Spur, slopes N. 35° W.; desc. over broken NW. slope, Leave timber, edge bears NW. and SE.; enter logged area.

19.755 Point for the E 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 27 and 34.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
