A shattered fir stump, bears N. 29° E., 63 lks. dist., with scribe marks 32 BT visible on bark blaze.

A root hole, bears S. 57° E., 19 lks. dist. alongside of which is down madrone, 20 ins. diam., with chopped open blaze, no marks visible.

A root hole, bears N. 10° W., 38 lks. dist., alongside of which is a down fir, 48 ins. diam., no marks visible.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 48½° E., 42 lks. dist. with healed blaze.

A fir stump, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 27½° W., 48 lks. dist., with scribe marks T32S R5W S33 CS BT visible on open blaze.

and new bearing trees

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 41 3/4° E., 63½ lks. dist., mkd. T32S R5W S27 BT.

The west fork of a twin cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 27½° W., 72½ lks. dist., mkd. T32S R5W S28 BT.

Corner is located 70 lks. east and approximately 25 ft. lower in elevation from dirt road, 25 lks. wide, bears N. and S.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, pine, fir, cedar, maple, oak, dogwood, madrone, ash, and alder; undergrowth, poison oak, ceanothus, Oregon grape, manzanita, salal, grass, and weeds.

From the cor. of secs. 21 and 22 only, on the N. bdy. of sec. 27, perpetuated and recorded by George J. Wenderoth, Registered Land Surveyor, No. 5, in 1956, monumented with an iron pipe, 3/4 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:
