Dependant Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines,  
T. 32 S., R. 5 W., Willamette Meridain, Oregon

CHAINS

From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  seccorofsecs. 22 and 27, perpetuated and recorded by George J. Wenderoth, Registered Land Surveyor, No. 5, in 1956, from original evidence no longer in existence, and subsequently rehabilitafed and recorded by the County Surveyor's Office, in 1980, monumented with an iron pipe,  $1\frac{1}{4}$  ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, from which bearing trees mkd. by Wenderoth:

A madrone, 19 ins. diam., bears N.  $52^\circ$  E.,  $42\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.  $50\frac{1}{4}^\circ$  W.,  $28\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by the County Surveyor's Office.

A madrone, 8 ins. diam., bears N.  $1\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  E. 21 lks. dist., with scribe marks  $\frac{1}{4}$  S22 CS BT visible on bark.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, directly over iron pipe, with brass cap mkd.

From this point, the cor. of secs, 22, 23, 26, and 27, bears S.  $89^\circ 36'$  E., 40.38 chs. dist., hereinbefore described.

N.  $89^\circ 26'$  W., bet. secs. 22 and 27.

Ascend over broken SE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 12.70 Ridge, bears N.  $45^\circ$  E. and S.  $45^\circ$  W., also dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears same; desc. over NW. slope, changing to N. slope.
- 19.85 Ravine, drains N.  $10^\circ$  E.; asc. over NE. slope.
- 24.65 Spur, slopes N.  $30^\circ$  E.; desc. over NW. slope.
- 28.90 Ravine, drains N.; asc. over NE. slope.
- 31.70 Spur, slopes N.; desc. over NW. slope.
- 32.65 Ravine, drains N.  $10^\circ$  W.; asc. over NE. slope.
- 38.70 Spur, slopes N.; desc. over NW. slope.
- 39.89 The cor.. of secs. 21 and 22 only.

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, pine, fir, cedar, maple, oak, dogwood, and madrone; undergrowth, poison oak, ceanothus, Oregon grape, manzanita, salal, grass, and weeds.
